**Navigation**

The Navigator is required to make logs, celestial sights and plots of the yacht's position during the race. (Four (4) plotting sheets will be inspected at Finish.)

**Recommendations**

- A. Draw boat batteries down; service, recharge and test prior to use.  
Test all electrical equipment.
- B. Test radio for distance (Not with a neighboring boat or in same marina).
- C. Test all electronics aboard vessel.

There will be random inspections after the finish in Honolulu.

Properly dispose of garbage and trash in Honolulu.
